



FUNDING AVAILABLE FOR NATURAL SOLUTIONS TO WATER POLLUTION

Managing water where it falls is an effective way to reduce pollution and water problems for neighbors downhill. Starting January 3, 2019, apply for funding from the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) to create new rain gardens, bioswales, green roofs and a variety of techniques that help capture and harness rain and melting snow. Our funding program is called the Green Infrastructure Partnership Program, or GIPP.

WHAT IS THE GIPP?

The program offers incentive funding on a per-gallon captured, reimbursement basis for a host of green infrastructure strategies designed to capture and clean water where it falls. Applications are competitively scored based on an established set of criteria focused on the applicant's ability and commitment to implement, maintain, and promote the project. MMSD is seeking partners that will foster the acceptance and implementation of green infrastructure (GI) as a viable means of managing water where it falls.

GUIDELINES FOR APPLYING

Projects must be located within the current MMSD GI service area and cannot be completed prior to the time of award. Applications must be submitted by property owners or developers.

Applications will be accepted until 10 AM CST on March 1, 2019.

Applicants are encouraged to attend a pre-application meeting on Tuesday, January 29, 2019 at 2 PM at MMSD Headquarters, 260 West Seeboth Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53204.
