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RISE PARTNERS CREATING OPPORTUNITIES

For the past eleven years the Regional Internships in Science & Engineering (RISE) program has connected dozens of students and employers as they develop talent for the Greater Milwaukee workforce. As we began recruitment for the 2021 RISE Program, we caught up with former student Elijah Gallien, who credits RISE for his career choice in Construction Management. "RISE has helped me choose my career tremendously," said Elijah. "Being given the opportunity to join the program as a college freshman and getting my first internship in the industry that summer helped me gain a better understanding of what a typical day looks like as a civil engineer. At that time, that's what I thought I wanted to be. After working side by side with civil engineers and project managers I was able to reshape the future of my career because I fell in love with the business side of construction and learned that I could get my degree in Construction Management rather than civil engineering. If it wasn't for RISE and getting real world experiences from my internships I probably would have been stuck with a degree and career that I didn't really love."

With RISE being a collaborative program, Elijah's second year was a unique experience. Showing interest in construction company J.H. Findorff & Son Inc., he cultivated a relationship between them, the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) and Prism Technical. "Findorff wasn't a part of the RISE program at that time, after switching my major and the RISE program not having a lot of general contractors hiring students, it felt great to be recognized for bringing an employer to the program and I knew I was on the right track for my career."


